Construction update December 2023/January 2024

There will be a pause on works on site from Thursday 21 December, with trades returning on Wednesday 10 January 2024.

Authorities

South East Water will be undertaking works along Southbank Boulevard between Kavanagh and Sturt Streets.

This will take place from Monday 4 December until Wednesday 20 December, between 7am and 5pm.

What to expect:

- Lane closures at the intersection of Southbank Boulevard and Kavanagh Street during work hours
- Bicycle path and pedestrian diversions during work hours
- Traffic Management presence to direct vehicles, cyclists and pedestrians
- Medium construction noise.

Piling in the intersection

You will notice piling happening in the Sturt/Kavanagh streets intersection. The Arts Centre Melbourne Car Park remains open but the piling rig will move around the intersection.

Vehicles should follow signs and instructions from traffic managers during construction hours, and follow signs and traffic signals after hours.

Vehicles will still be able to access Arts Centre Melbourne's carpark from Kavanagh Street. Exit is via Southbank Boulevard only until early next year.

Pedestrians are prohibited from entering the intersection at any time.

Pedestrians can walk to St Kilda Road via the footbridge on Level 4 of The Primrose Potter Australian Ballet Centre during the building's opening hours.

The footbridge is currently accessible from 6am to 1am Monday to Saturday, and 9am to 11pm on Sunday.

77 Southbank Boulevard

There will be minimal truck movements off Southbank Boulevard as scaffold is delivered to site.

Several trees will be removed within our project boundary on Sturt Street throughout December to allow for scaffold installation.
