



Construction Works Notification

February 2026

We are writing to provide details on streetscape and roadworks being undertaken at the Nyaal Banyul Geelong Convention and Event Centre precinct, Western Beach Road.

Streetscape Works and Road Closure

Streetscape works along all precinct frontages, including the future public plaza on the corner of Western Beach Road and Gheringhap Street and the space on the corner of Cavendish Street and Smythe Street, will continue through February 2026.

Works will include civil, earth and structural works, along with road surfacing. The following changes to vehicle and pedestrian access will facilitate these works:

- **Western Beach Road** will be closed for road upgrade works between Cavendish Street and Gheringhap Street from **Tuesday 10 February 2026 to Friday 6 March 2026**. Construction street signage and traffic management will be in place during this time.

Electronic signage along Eastern Beach Road and Western Beach Road will be installed week commencing 2 February 2026 to provide motorists with advance warning and an opportunity for early detour to reduce congestion in the development area.

- The footpath adjacent to the construction site on **Gheringhap Street** remains closed, with pedestrian thoroughfare and Deakin entry maintained from the eastern side footpath.
- **Smythe Street** will be reopened to two-way traffic in February 2026, date to be confirmed.
- A work zone is established on **Cavendish Street** between Western Beach Road and Smythe Street resulting in loss of street parking for the duration of works. Two-way traffic will be maintained
